From Pastor Rebecca,

Here at the height of the pandemic, we all need a vaccination against gloom and doom. One of my favorite preachers, William Sloane Coffin, Jr., once wrote in one of his books about hope: "While I am not optimistic, I am hopeful. By this I mean that hope, as opposed to cynicism and despair, is the sole precondition for a new and better life; and hope arouses, as nothing else can arouse, a passion for the possible." [Coffin, A Passion for the Possible]



My friends, this is so true for 2021. Hope is the sole precondition for a new and better life. And that hope comes to us in the shape of Jesus. But

we have a remarkable ability to forget that in our dayto-day lives. And we are especially apt to lose hope when we lose our connections to other people.

We have several more months to get through before we get to our post-Covid reality, whatever that will be. And we are going to need to nurture those ties that bind us together or Christ won't have a Methodist Body to minister to the needs of our community. There is looming before us a huge task of rebuilding that community, and we need to start here, now.

We need a passion for what is possible in terms of gathering hearts and minds and, safely, bodies. I have been tossing around some ideas and would like to know which ones you

Ideas for Rebuilding Community

- Telling our stories through writing Lenten devotions, as we did in Advent
- In the spirit of Story Corps (on NPR), doing video interviews with the spiritual redwoods in our congregation and sharing their stories in a private Facebook group
- Doing a church-wide book study and sermon series that would engage everyone in the same topic for a season
- Bringing a prepared and packaged scone and tea bag (or other small goodie) to our friends in isolation once a month
- Forming walking, hiking or birdwatching groups that could meet outside and keep social distance, weather permitting
- Restarting the phone tree and making sure our callers are calling each person weekly.
- Holding sermon talk-back sessions on Zoom following Sunday morning worship, with the option of break-out sessions for smaller group discussions.

We are all anxious for 2021 to be different than 2020. The situation is not going to change quickly, but the ways we are responding to it can change. I'll close with another quote from an old seminary professor of mine at Duke, Stanley Hauerwas: "Hope does not necessarily take the form of excessive confidence; rather, it involves the simple willingness to take the next step." We can't do everything, but we can take the next step. What will it be, EFUMC?

Virtual Advent Tea raises real money



Through the mailed invitations and virtual online program, we raised \$2810 for blankets and food for our neighbors in Humboldt County. Half the funds went to Food for People. Another \$500 went to provide blankets to the homeless. The Missions Committee will be

redirecting the remaining funds to people in need in our community.

One final #BASK update from Cheryl Churchill





With all your generous contributions, we were able to provide 160 bundles of new blankets and Squishmallows for homeless and housing insecure children in Humboldt. Clover's goal was exceeded by 60%! That is huge...but there's more. Lifehouse Humboldt and Eureka First United Methodist Church were both helping to raise funds to support this outreach. When we could no longer take donations because we just couldn't distribute any more bundles, EFUMC redirected the money raised for BASK and purchased over 70 blankes for Saint Vincent de Paul to hand out on Christmas. With the pandemic this year, blankets have been in short supply. I'm so thrilled they had help with their blanket drive. (continues on next page)

Individually, this all would have been an expensive and arduous endeavor. But this illustrates to me so clearly that if we all just do a little, together, we can do really big things. Thank you again for all who supported BASK and helping make Clover's dream a reality. While we won't get to see the excitement on all those faces Christmas Day, rest assured you have given many people something to smile about.
